

## Letter from the Chair of Governors – Mrs Belinda Hansford

On behalf of the Governing Body, I have pleasure in presenting the Annual Report to Parents for 2022/2023.

This year was a return to usual practice after all the issues with Covid, and the school held all the usual school events including Christmas Concerts, Summer Sports Day and the Fete. Pupils were able to attend residential courses, outside sporting events and go on many trips – as well as welcome many visitors to school. You will find information about all this in the report.

During the year we had two PGCE students who both completed their time with us successfully and we are continuing with a new student for the coming year.

We have completed the second part of the Erasmus project and a booklet has been published which can be found on the new school website at <u>www.crwysprimary.co.uk</u> under We Are Pupil Voice – International School.

Attendance has seen some reductions in our usual high levels, but the school is working to get this back to our pre-Covid levels.

The school continues to support the wellbeing of pupils and as well as outdoor learning, there has been counselling support available which has been used as required.

We are also pleased that Childsplay are continuing to offer afternoon nursery and after school club to support parents' childcare needs.

In May, Mrs Tracy Burnell our School Manager moved onto a fulltime position as a Primary Support Officer, we would like to thank her for her service in the school and her work as Clerk to the Governors. We wish her well in her new role which does see her continuing to visit the school. We were pleased to welcome Mrs Victoria Evans in her place towards the end of the Summer term and she is settling in to her role at the heart of the school.

Our caretaker Mr Mike Collins secured a role in a school much nearer to home and although sorry to lose someone so willing to take on all the tasks around school, we wish him well. His replacement Darryl Griffiths is proving to be of the same ilk and is doing lots of painting and minor repairs around the site.

As always there have been other changes involving both welcoming a range of new TAs and seeing staff leave on maternity leave.

As I enter my 6<sup>th</sup> year as Chair of Governors, I am proud to be associated with the school.

#### PUPIL ASSESSMENTS

The school completed a number of teacher assessments including some summative tests in order to inform planning and gauge pupil progression.

#### ATTENDANCE

Due to COVID, attendance data was once again not gathered and assessed during the year however, it is fair to say that on the whole at the times when attendance was possible, our levels were encouraging. We aim to work to return to our pre-Covid levels during the 23/24 Academic Year.

#### **Basic Information and Curriculum**

Crwys Primary is a school that delivers the Curriculum in English. During the year 2022/2023 the school has been delivering the curriculum according to the Donaldson guidelines and the four core purposes. All major subjects are currently covered, and full information can be found in the School Prospectus. Information covering specific areas is outlined below.

#### School Prospectus

#### Outdoor Schools

Outdoor learning is, as before, a key focus for the school. Pupils visit either Dukefield Woods or Priors Meadow Wood on a weekly basis.

The school's outdoor provision was highlighted by Estyn as highly effective; 'The use of outdoor learning to enhance pupils' attitudes to learning and improve their wellbeing is excellent and this ensures that pupils are developing into confident learners.' As a result the school now has a case study on Effective Practice page on Estyn's website: <u>https://www.estyn.gov.wales/effective-practice/taking-teaching-outdoors</u>

In addition, the case study has been recognised as effective practice at Consortia and Local Authority level.

During the school year the second phase of the Erasmus project was completed, with visits to partner schools abroad as well as a final meeting back in Swansea. Following the success of the Activity booklet produced after the first cycle which has been shared across Swansea and beyond, a second booklet is in the process of being produced.

#### Welsh Language Provision

During the year, the school has worked on the Siarter laith/Language Charter as we begin our journey towards the Welsh Charter Silver Award. Pupil Voice in the form of an elected 'Criw Cymraeg' has been encouraging and highlighted where Welsh can be used throughout the school.

#### Special Teaching Facility

The Facility caters for children with special educational needs and is supported by regular visits from speech therapists, the school psychological service, welfare officers and the school doctor. The Facility has a special place within the school and wider community and pupils are integrated into the mainstream classes wherever possible.

#### Physical Education at Crwys Primary

Physical Education plays an important role at the school. In addition to Physical Education lessons, we have a comprehensive extra-curricular programme. This of course, in addition to our Outdoor Learning programme.

#### Healthy School

Crwys Primary School is very involved in the Swansea Health Promoting Schools Scheme. UNCRC – Article 24 – Your right to good food and water - All food and drink prepared for the children during school time and After School Club is expected to follow Swansea County Council healthy eating guidelines. During break times we have a 'fruit only' policy, as decided upon by the School Council.

We ask parents of children who bring a packed lunch to school to make every effort to ensure that the packed lunch contains a healthy eating and drinking selection. This is consistent with our Health Promoting Policy. Staff are also encouraged to follow Healthy Schools' guidelines.

Drinking water – Drinking plenty of cold, fresh water helps to develop concentration skills and the well-being of the individual. We ensure that our children have access to cold, fresh drinking water throughout the school day. Our Healthy Schools co-ordinator is Mrs Rachel Harris.

We have already received the 5<sup>th</sup> leaf as part of the Welsh Network of Healthy School Schemes.

#### **Rights Respecting Schools**

Article 2 - All children have these rights no matter what!

At Crwys Primary we've been working hard this term to become a Rights Respecting School. The Rights Respecting Schools Award is a programme run by UNICEF that aims to put children's rights at the centre of education in the UK. This involves embedding children's rights into the ethos and culture of the school in order to improve the pupils' wellbeing.

#### **Staff Training and Insets**

A range of training has taken place preparing teachers for the new curriculum, Welsh and ALN provision.

In addition, during this year we welcomed two PGCE students to term on placements, both of which were completed successfully.

#### **Premises**

Repairs and decoration has continued throughout the school with Mr Collins former caretaker and current caretaker Mr Griffiths performing much of the work themselves. During the year repairs to the roof on the Junior Block were completed by contractors to prevent further leakage in the roof.

#### **Toilet Facilities:**

The toilets are in a good state of repair and are cleaned regularly by the school cleaner.

#### Links to the Community

This school year saw the return of the Fete which was well attended with good weather. The Governors continue to support the inclusion of news about the school in the Village Newsletter. The School also works with the Crwys District Sports Association in the use of the Crwys Woodland for school activities.

#### Parent Teacher Association

The PTA managed to raise through a number of activities a total of £6,000 and funds were provided to the school to develop a new website, purchase 13 Chrome Books, a new laminator, and nursery equipment.
